We are sad to note that Dot (nee Bewley) has died aged 95. She was a regular at High House (*below, seated bottom right*) in the 1930s and 40s and married Walter Dennison, one of the stalwarts of the Fellfearers in those early days. Perhaps the last link with the very beginnings of the club.



High House Lease Negotiations

Almost there! The roller-coaster of negotiations has continued since the report in the last newsletter but we should finally have an agreed document within the next few days. There have been some late disagreements and compromises but they are mainly to do with the wording of the document rather than the substance. The Management Sub-committee is confident that we now have a document that is very much better than the first proposals from the Trust. There will now be a final checking by our solicitor and briefing of the Trustees and the committee before the formality of the signing.

The committee has now received the £2,500 which Rod left to the club on his death. Members were asked in the last newsletter to come forward with ideas on how best to spend the money (half on social event(s) and half on High House. No-one did come forward so the committee is asking again for suggestions before it makes any decision.
