2. Members' Night Fees

Members will recall that the committee has spent the last couple of years attempting to find painless ways to put the Club's finances onto a sound and sustainable footing. As well as the Monthly Draw (above) the proposal has been to trial a Members' Night Fee scheme for staying at High House. The proposed scheme has been set out in previous newsletters. The Committee will put a proposition to the AGM (see below) to establish the right to set up such a scheme.

The good news is that 2017 has been a good year for the Club financially and income has been such that the Committee proposes that the Members' Night Fee for 2018 will be $\pounds 0$.

Expenditure can fluctuate from year to year and there is still an underlying insecurity in our financial position. The proposed scheme will establish the committee's right to take action when needed in future, but for now: *no extra cost for members to stay at High House.*

The last newsletter reported that we are "almost there!". We still are but at the time of writing, still not quite. There is just one last question that we are seeking reassurance on from our own solicitor. If the answer is "Yes" we can go ahead and sign. Watch this space....

Rod Muncey bequest

As reported préviously, Rod left £2,500 to the club on his death, to be split equally between social events and High House.

Ideas proposed so far are:

- 1. A coach trip to a location suitable for various walks for all abilities, with an evening meal on the journey home. This reflects the tradition of walk/meals which used to be such a popular part of the clubs social life (and in fact reflect the charabanc trips that were the very beginning of the club before High House). Possible destinations are: Moffat/the Borders, North York Moors, Peak District or North Wales.
- 2. A boat trip across Ullswater to various walks around Martindale (in recognition of the day the club gathered round for Rod's Last Wainwright on his 50th birthday).
- 3. A picnic table for High House with a slate top from Honister, perhaps carved with images of local birds and Rod's name.

If you have any more suggestions, please let a committee member know as soon as possible - decisions will be made in the next couple of months.

Lunch was eaten here in front of a superb view from the rivals in the south to Anglesey and the Menai Straits to the north. A return was made across the land bridge until we could descend the ridge from Trum y Ddysgl down to Bwlch y ddwy elor.
