Recent Club Events

Tuesday 22nd - Thursday 24th October 2019 Away Meet in Rhyd-Ddu for Midweek Walk No. 114

Just six members attended what is becoming another fixture in the Fellfarer year. The forecast was good so five us travelled down on Monday to get an extra day in. On Tuesday, while Clare visited a friend, Jenny, Norman, Kevin and Mick climbed Tryfan by its north ridge, a grade 1 scramble that has seen many Mountain Rescue call-outs over the years (it is very easy to stray onto difficult ground, particularly for those who lose their nerve and try to go back down). No-one lost their nerve and, although there was a certain amount of straying onto ground beyond the grade 1 category, the team passed the Cannon and shortly after arrived at the summit, a first ascent for three of us. It was too breezy for anyone to consider the bold stride from Adam to Eve and getting too late in the day to consider the continuation scramble of Bristly Ridge so we wandered down into Cwm Bochlwyd and took the track over the foot of the Gribin ridge to Llyn Idwal. Mick suggested that a summer midweek trip would give Fellfarers the opportunity to sample some of the classic climbs that Snowdonia offers in

abundance.

Jan joined us in the Cwellyn Arms that evening and the six of us discussed options for the Midweek Walk. We chose Cnicht, the 'Welsh Matterhorn'.

So on Wednesday, a cool bright day with lots of blue sky, we drove to Croesor. We climbed the obvious scrambly southwest ridge and were soon on the rocky summit, enjoying the splendid 360° panorama of mountains and coastline. We wandered northwards, crossing the boggy ground of Cwm-y-foel to explore the enigmatic 'deserted village' of the Rhosydd/Cwmorthin quarries. We had lunch perched on slate walls in the sunshine there and Mick tried to find a level he had explored solo many years ago. The favourite contender was deep in water at its entrance so he put his headtorch away.

It had been 'half a plan' to continue to Moelwyn Mawr but as we climbed towards the abandoned Croesor quarry the sun was already low in the sky. We descended the superb grassy incline into Cwm Croesor and so back to our waiting cars. We celebrated what had been a fine mountain day with beer and a bar meal in the Cwellyn Arms that night.

On Thursday we all went home but Kevin and Jan made the most of the good weather with a traverse of the eastern end of the Nantlle ridge first.

Eventually the group arrived at the stepping stones across Borrow Beck. Instead they walked down the valley and returned along the ridge on the north side of the valley.

Meanwhile, the 9 members who had the made the crossing continued up the Breasthigh Road and descended to Bretherdale Head. having lost so much time through the various incidents, the decision was made to cut the walk short by walking up Bretherdale to emerge on the A6 at the Shap summit. The return to the cars was made along the old turnpike road down to Hause Foot and back to High Borrow Bridge. By a quirk of timing they arrived at the same time as the other group!
